SNAP-CHARITY

SNAP is an invaluable provider of services to children and young people with additional support needs.

We provide regular activities for 100 families through After School Clubs, Holiday Leisure Schemes, 'Out and Abouts' in the community, weekend breaks and Youth Clubs

WHO ARE WE?

SNAP (Special Needs Action Project) is a registered Scottish Charity (SCO24792) based in Inverness. Founded in November 1996, as a parent support group SNAP has grown to become the Highlands largest support organisation of its kind.

SNAP currently employs 20 staff and has 15 people who work in a voluntary capacity





WHAT DO WE DO?

All of our services provide a place for children and young people to make friends in a safe and supportive environment, but they crucially also offer so many additional benefits:-

FUN is at the heart of everything we do. People with disabilities often have medical needs prioritised over everything else - at SNAP the main aim is fun

Tackling loneliness and isolation – SNAP provides a place where people feel they belong and, by having regular time at SNAP, feelings of loneliness and isolation are tackled.

Confidence and Resilience – SNAP is a place where our service users are supported to push their boundaries, achieve and learn new skills and try new activities

Life skills – In supporting our users to push boundaries, they in turn learn valued life skills with SNAP. We encourage active participation – children and adults alike are given choice, encouraged to give ideas on things they'd like to do, which promotes independence, organisation and empowerment

Respite – carers use the time whilst their children or young adults are at a SNAP activity in a variety of ways, but essentially, SNAP allows them regular, valued time off from their caring role.
